Grand prizes will include a Kindle Paperwhite, a gift certificate to Lift Bridge Books, and a snow-themed gift basket.

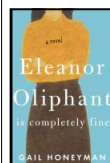

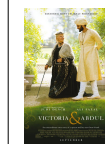
Helix Hat Knitting Class

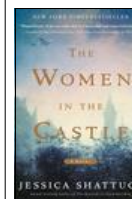
